The game started poorly as Coltishall struck twice in the first five minutes with a well worked goal from a corner followed by a long-range drive from the edge of the box. With regular keeper Bertie being rested, Reuben took the gloves but couldn't quite manage to keep either shot out. He was however able to save the Comets moments later when he rushed off his line to smother another attack from the home side.

The Comets were rattled but somehow found a way back into the game with two moments of magic from Otto.
