### What does Phonics look like at Colby?

From their first few weeks in school, our EYFS / Reception children follow a systematic synthetic phonics program. Our DFE recognised scheme, 'Twinkl Phonics' has proved to be popular with the children and very effective as a learning tool.

Children are introduced to individual letters or groups of letters and learn what sound or 'phoneme' they make. Children in EYFS / Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 enjoy daily phonics sessions when they follow the specific sounds and spelling patterns appropriate to their developmental stage. They learn in small groups and we carefully monitor their progress through regular assessments. Children may move phonics groups as their needs change.

We practise blending sounds to make whole words using fun practical activities and learning. Children take a reading book home to practise these new skills with parents.

At the end of Year 1, children will take the national Phonics Screening Check, which assesses how many of the 40 phonemes children can 'read'.

- We have attached an overview of the phonics we cover. Phase 1 4 is covered in EYFS / Reception. Phase 5 is covered in Year 1.
- Also included is the Phase 2 sound mat where you can see each phoneme we cover in order.
- We introduce the children to an action for each phoneme and there is a copy of these for you too.

I will be running a phonics/reading meeting for parents on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October at 9am. Could you please let the office know if you are able to attend, so that I have an idea of numbers. Thank you.

If you have any questions on phonics or early reading before then, please come and find me!
