I've had a couple of questions regarding school meals this week, so I thought I would include my answers on the newsletter for all of your information. As you know we will be conducting a survey regarding meals with children and parents this term. This will take place later in the term when Year 6 have completed their National Tests. Year 6 will help to interview younger children about their favourite foods and this information will be included on the survey sent out to parents.

I've been asked why we don't operate a 2 or 3 week rolling menu to offer more choice over the half term. We have done this in the past but parents and children found it confusing and preferred us to have the same menu each week. I am happy to review this and it will be a question on the parent survey.

We haven't moved over to a summer menu yet because the weather is so cold and children are still enjoying their sausage and mash etc. We will review the menu again when we see some sunshine – fingers crossed this will be soon!

I've been asked why we don't use Norse to provide our dinners or follow the Norse menu. We have a small kitchen at Colby School and cannot offer the daily range of choices that Norse can. We have considered using Norse to provide our meals in the past and researched this. Governors voted unanimously against using Norse due to the cost - we would have needed to heavily subsidise the Norse meals and make unwanted cuts elsewhere to do so.

Thank you to Megan and Vikki for all their hard work in Colby Kitchen. They have continued to adapt the menu following feedback from children – aiming to provide meals that are enjoyed by all. Thank you to those of you who have been in touch to say how much your children enjoy their school dinners. Macaroni cheese has been a great addition to the menu and sausage and mash remains a firm favourite! If you have any meal suggestions you would like to share before the parent survey, please let me know.
