#### Amber Class Curriculum Autumn 2

This half term is another busy and super exciting one for Amber Class. We have spent the week learning about Bonfire Night as well as safety around fireworks and how to care for our pets. We all had a great time at our bonfire party earlier on in the week and loved toasting marshmallows around the fire pit and making s'mores - yummy!

From now until Christmas our topic is called' Magical Me'. The children have asked to learn about the following things within this topic:

- How to make magic potions.
- Writing some magic recipes.
- How to do magic art.
- How to be magicians.

As Christmas is also coming up, the children have also asked to learn about:

- How to make Christmas food such as Christmas biscuits and Christmas sweets.
- How to make presents for Santa.
- Why Christmas is celebrated.
- How Christmas is celebrated around the world.
- How to write letters to Santa.
- How to make Christmas crafts.

In English we will be using fantasy stories. Children will retell a story using role-play and freezeframes to sequence events. They will also write their own versions of a story. There will be opportunities to write instructions for magical potions such as magical ink! Children will also explore the use of poetic language and rhyme to create our own magical poetry.

In Maths Reception children will be learning to say the next number from 0-20, order the days of the week, become confident to name 2D shapes and sort into Venn diagrams. Year 1 children will double numbers, practice addition and subtraction skills and confidently name 2D and 3D shapes. As always this will be done in a fun and practical way.

Within our foundation subjects, we will be learning about seasonal and daily weather patterns in Geography; Football and netball in PE; Colour Chaos in Art; Families and people who care for us in Life Skills; The Christmas story in RE; Learning songs for the Christmas play in Music; Materials in Science.

We are looking forward to welcoming Amber Class families into school on 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2024 for our Christmas craft afternoon.

### Sapphire Class Curriculum Autumn 2

I cannot believe we are in the second half of the Autumn Term already!

**PE:** Sapphire Class will continue to have PE on Tuesdays (with Ben) and Fridays (with Miss Covell). Please make sure that your child has adequate warm outdoor PE clothes as we will be outside for our netball skills sessions with Ben.

**English:** We will be sharing stories on 'dragons'! We will be writing character and setting descriptions using adjectives, adverbs (Year 2) and conjunctions. Children continue to have daily phonics sessions and their reading books should be matched to their phonics level (on the reverse of each book you can find the PHASE number). Children will have a short spelling test every Friday morning and all spelling lists will be posted on our Google Classroom page. Year 2s will continue learning new hand writing joins and Year 1s will be shoring up correct formation and orientation of all their letters, both lower case and capitals. Support with this can be found on our Google Classroom page.

In **Maths** we will be working on addition and subtraction within numbers up to 100 (Year 2s) and 30 (Year 1s). We will be using practical objects as well as number tracks. Year 2s will be learning to use their own number line to add and subtract two 2 digit numbers. Please find maths games on our Google Classroom page as the children will know how to play these.

History: We will be finding out about the Great Fire of London, when, why and how it happened.

We will discover who Samuel Pepys was and explore different types of historical sources. **Art:** We are finding out about Pablo Picasso and will be using his work to inspire us to create self-portraits, 'Picasso style'! I look forward to seeing these!

Mrs. Moulton will be working with Sapphire children on **computing** and will be working on pictograms.

In our **Life Skills** sessions with Miss Covell, we will be discussing different types of bullying (online and cyber bullying).

We will shortly begin learning our songs which will form part of our Christmas performance! As always, we will join with Amber Class for this and we will let you know shortly about parts and which costumes children will require.

A huge THANK YOU to your support with your children when they brought home the class sock monkeys! I have been amazed at how busy and what wonderful adventures they have had and it's been wonderful to see how hard the children have worked on writing their diary extracts. Malcom and Mabel will continue their travelling with the children this term.

Please ensure that your child has a change of **outdoor shoes** in school from now on as the weather becomes wetter. An old pair of trainers/wellies are ideal. Don't forget to name them!

#### Emerald Class Curriculum Autumn 2

Welcome back everyone. I am very excited about the term ahead with two new additions to the Emerald family and Christmas fun on the horizon!

We have been learning about Remembrance this week which kicks off our WW2 History unit. We will learn about the Black-out and the Blitz and what life was like for women and children during the war.

In Maths we are finishing off our addition unit before switching to multiplication and division. Any counting in 2's, 5's and 10's at home would be very helpful!

In English we will be listening, performing and writing some poetry, using some poems by a local author, A.F. Harold. We will be writing some diary extracts and some stories as well.

In D.T. we will be creating some really interesting electrical systems and we will of course squeeze in some extra Christmas artwork later in the term.

In PE the children will be finishing our football unit, playing netball and thinking about our Colby Value of 'social'. We started this on Wednesday by trying to give feedback to each other and sharing opinions. It's a great unit and helps children develop important life skills.

Alice will switch to French this term on a Thursday which will be really fun.

Mrs Towers will continue to teach music on a Monday as well as lots of singing and play rehearsal fun!

Ms Everett will still teach RE on Thursday mornings and will focus on Sikhism.

Some of the children have been bringing in optional homework which has been great to see and it would be lovely if you could keep up with spellings, times tables and of course reading every week.

The class have come back and settled in well and performed brilliantly in our Remembrance Service today. I can't believe how brave they all were. We are all so proud of them!

**Ruby Class Curriculum Autumn 2** 

In Ruby Class this half term we started with learning our poems for Remembrance Service.

We will now move on to looking at writing descriptions using the book The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. We will then use Roald Dahl's Revolting Rhymes to write our own narrative poetry. We will also be writing our own balanced arguments about staying safe online. As well as this, we will be continuing with our weekly spellings. Please make sure that your child learns their spellings each week either by using Spelling Shed or any other method.

Please can you also make sure that your child is also reading daily and writing this in their reading records. Please sign to say that you have heard or seen them read.

In Maths, we will start by concentrating on learning the times tables and division facts up to 12 x 12. Please could you make sure that your child is learning these regularly especially for the times tables test on a Monday. They could either use Hit The Button or Sumdog to help them. We will then use this knowledge to help to solve questions about multiples, factors, square numbers and prime numbers. We will also be learning how to multiply and divide larger numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.

In Science, we will be continuing to learn about materials and will be looking at reversible and irreversible changes.

Our history topic this term is The Shang Dynasty. We will be looking at when this period of history happened, the different Gods and Kings they had, what life was like living in this period of time and also look at some different artefacts from this period.

This term they will continue to have Mr Brown and Ben for PE. They will be continuing to do some football but will also be learning new skills within the sport of netball.

In music, we will be learning the Christmas songs for our KS2 pantomime called 'Cinderella Rockerfella'. The children will also be given small parts as part of the play and will have rehearsals throughout this half term.

In Computing with Mrs Moulton, they will be learning about creating websites and creating their own. Mr Mead will continue teaching RE and French. This half term, they will be doing DT with Mr Frost. They are going to be making cam-controlled pop-ups, and they will need to bring in a small but strong/stiff box. Washing powder boxes are great and can be plastic or thick cardboard. We'll need these by this Tuesday.

## Amethyst Class Curriculum Autumn 2

I hope you all had a lovely break and the children are ready for another hard-working term!

I would like to share with you all the topics and areas we will be covering.

Maths:

We look in slightly more detail this half-term at multiple mark questions and problem solving where two or more operations are used. Timetables are still crucial and any work children can do at home is invaluable. Hit the button is an ideal website. Some children will begin to get some IXL homework, initially on areas they need extra arithmetic practise on, but later, on concept areas we are covering in class. We recommend you purchase a Mathematics Study Book (available from school) to support your child with mathematical vocabulary and revision of all subjects covered during Key Stage 2. <u>Science:</u>

This half term we are covering living things and their habitats.

English:

Our key text this half term is 'A Christmas Carol'. Before we get to that, we are looking at devices in stories for effective setting, dialogue and plot devices for cohesion. We will also cover persuasive texts. We have Study Books available to purchase for Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation – this will support homework in this area.

History:

After a couple more lessons finishing off deserts, we move onto the early Islamic empire and Spanish reconquest.

<u>P.E:</u>

(Wednesday and Friday afternoons)

We are developing netball and dodgeball skills this half term with a focus on social skills within sports.

<u>R.E:</u> Amethyst will be learning about how Islamic beliefs have influenced art.

French: Children will continue to learn French, developing accent and a range of vocabulary.

Life Skills: We are developing our leadership roles further this half-term with even more independent planning and delivery of activities and skills.

<u>D.T:</u> We will be making hats. If children want to embellish theirs with unusual materials they bring from home, they are very welcome!

IT: Mrs. Moulton will be looking into programming games.

We will be regularly watching Newsround and discussing issues that might relate to us.
